 - ***Shadow Divers* by Robert Kurson** – (Non-fiction) A true tale of riveting adventure in which two weekend scuba divers risk everything to solve one of the last mysteries of World War II.
 - ***Friday Night Lights* by H.G. Bissinger** – (Non-fiction) The timeless account of the 1988 Permian Panthers of Odessa – the winningest high-school football team in Texas history.
 - ***Will Grayson, Will Grayson* by John Green and David Levithan** – (Fiction) One cold night, in a most unlikely corner of Chicago, Will Grayson crosses paths with . . . Will Grayson. Two teens with the same name, running in two very different circles, suddenly find their lives going in new and unexpected directions. The story is told in alternating voices from two popular young adult authors.
 - ***Miss Peregrine’s Home for Peculiar Children* by Ransom Riggs** – (Fiction) A mysterious island, an abandoned orphanage, and a strange collection of very curious photographs . . . It all waits to be discovered in this an unforgettable novel that mixes fiction and photography in a thrilling reading experience.
